

1. PATAKA Cover - Suggestions and comments were requested in our last issue and the following has been received on the subject by our Southern Scribe. -

'An excellent step in the right direction. - What about spending some of the Corps Funds on coloured paper so that each edition can appear with a different colour in rotation (e.g. Blue, Pink, Yellow, White, Green, being the basic commonly available shades). Also - how about printing (duplicating) the edition number e.g. '71/6' between the heading "PATAKA" and the top of the design?

There is a simple reply to these suggestions - We requested and were refused different colours for the covers by the gentleman i/c stationery at Home Command, and only after much haggling were we permitted to have 1,000 covers run off in white. As approx 125 copies go out with each edition this will cover the requirement until this time next year. The purchase of coloured duplicating paper from Corps funds is to be discussed in the near future and a decision will be advised. However, as the present stocks of white covers would look queer over coloured bodies we may be stuck with white until they are run down by at least half, when the remainder could be reserved for the white edition if the colour scheme is adopted.

To adopt the second suggestion that the edition number be superimposed on the cover would mean re-running all our remaining stock through the machine again with consequent loss due to spoilage. There is no reason why the edition No. could not be inserted on the covers as copies are received by units.

report now back on full duty and feeling fit.





WHAT A SOLDIER CAN OR HAS EXPERIENCED




BOD ANNUAL BOTTLE EXERCISE & RANGE PRACTICE
