Extract from the War Diary (notes) of Div Ordnance Workshops for April 1943.

il 2.: "Based on a period of approximately three months operations in the field, the following observations are made:

"Due to the hard road conditions, spring breakages are relatively high. Large stocks of built-up springs and spring steel bar stocks appear to be very necessary. Wet weather makes MT repairs very difficult without concreted areas and tarpaulin shelters. "Creepers" are being constructed to allow the mechanics to keep dry. It is suggested for future guidance that such technical equipment be amongst first ~~taxies~~ of any shipped.

"The slow supply of replacement parts is proving a handicap in expediting repairs. This position could be relieved if consideration was given to supply of parts available before types and makes of vehicles were shipped. With the variety of models to be serviced, the position can only be assisted by generous supplies of raw materials, i.e., C.V. steel for axles, pins etc., spring steel bar stocks for odd springs, welding materials for smash work, enamel coated wire for re-winding generators and armatures, phosphor-bronze for bushes ; pressed fibre sheet for electrical installations, washers etc ; complete range of B.A. (British Association) Thread screws, nuts bolts and taps and dies, for armament and instrument repairs ; a good type of 'hot-patch' vulcaniser for tyre repairs. A milling attachment with Keyway cutter for at least one lathe in the machinery wagons should be included in this unit's equipment. A spring collett set for instrument work is a necessary attachment for one of the small 4½" lathes in the Canadian type Machinery lorry."
