NZ has 20,000 nets on order from US, and large quantity of netting on order from India. When received these quantities will cover requirements for 2 years. NZ suggests NO action be taken in future by NZEFIP for other supplies. (Signal originated in offer of 4000 mosquito nets from local US forces). <u>SOME (Armt)</u> : AA & QMG requested information re Armament stores ; assurance given that sufficient stocks are held or are budgeted for to service the Div for a period of 5 months in operations.
