NEW ZEALAND EXPEDITIONARY FORCE (1914).

The following orders are promulgated by the General Officer Commanding New Zealand Defence Forces:— **G.O. 213.**

1914.

(1.) FORMATION OF EXPEDITIONARY FORCE FOR SERVICE OUTSIDE THE DOMINION OF NEW ZEALAND.

His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction the formation of an Expeditionary Force for service outside the Dominion of New Zealand. This Force is to be known as "The New Zealand Expeditionary Force (1914)."

(4.) CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

Applications to join the Expeditionary Force will be received from volunteers under the following categories, in the order named:—

- (a.) The Regiment of Royal New Zealand Artillery.
The New Zealand Staff Corps.
The N.Z. Permanent Staff.
- (b.) Territorials now serving, over twenty years of age, including officers on Unattached List (a) and (b).
- (c.) Territorial Force Reserve.
- (d.) Failing a sufficient supply of volunteers from these sources, applications from other men *with previous military experience*, between the ages of twenty and thirty-five years, will be entertained. All such volunteers under this subsection are primarily to be enlisted into the Territorial Force.
 - (i.) *Period of Service.*—Applicants will be required to undertake to serve for the term of the present European War, and for such further period as is necessary to bring the Expeditionary Force back to New Zealand to be disbanded.
 - (ii.) *Age.*—No one is to be included in this Force who has not reached the age of twenty years or who has attained the age of thirty-five. (Officers Commanding Area Groups are responsible that the statements of age are checked with the record-books, and that any misstatements are notified to their District Headquarters.)
 - (iii.) *Preference given to Single Men.*—Preference is to be given to single men.
 - (iv.) *Medical Examination.*—All ranks will be required to undergo a medical examination by an officer of the N.Z. Medical Corps before signing the attestation paper.
 - (v.) *Height and Weight.*—No one will be accepted whose height is under 5 ft. 4 in. and whose weight exceeds 12 stone, except in special cases.
 - (vi.) *Mounted Rifle Volunteers.*—Mounted Rifle Volunteers must bring with them a serviceable saddlery equipment in addition to a horse. Both horse and saddlery must be passed by a Board of Officers before being accepted.

(6.) QUOTAS TO BE SUPPLIED BY DISTRICTS.

The following schedules show the detail of numbers to be supplied by districts. Each district provides a complete Mounted Rifles Regiment and a complete Infantry Battalion in addition to details for other divisional units. In order to render the Territorial connection complete, each existing unit will, as far as possible, be allowed to furnish a complete company, &c. (or smaller formation) to the Expeditionary Force unit provided by the district.

Artillery.

The personnel of the Artillery units detailed for the Expeditionary Force will be selected from volunteers from the R.N.Z.A. (F.A. Section) and from the N.Z. Field Artillery (Territorial Force). Each of the gun batteries will provide an 18-pr. Q.F. gun complete with its detachment. In addition each district will furnish a list of volunteers (all ranks) from the R.N.Z.A. (F.A. Section), gun and howitzer battery, T.F.A.

In the case of the Wellington District, a list of volunteers from the Mountain Battery will be furnished.

All R.N.Z.A. cadre horses will be taken in addition to others purchased.
