	1		To M.E. with deficiencies of Bren guns and A.T. rifles. Saw A.D.O.S. (B.T.E) in regard to rail heads for our Units in the W.D. Then to A.D.O.S.(P) in connection with summer clothing for 3rd Contingent. Decided not to draw second pair of hosetops for 1st. Contingent so that there will be one pair at least available for the 3rd. Echelon.

Egypt.	Sept. 1940		
	16		Conference with D.A.Q.M.G. and G.S.O.2. then to Res. M.T.Coy. On to Mersa Matruh and found a lot of stores for all units with R.O.O. Arranged for delivery of stores. Then to 19 Bn. and finally A.D.O.S. W.D.F. with whom I arranged necessary procedure regarding indents etc. Drafted D.R.O's in regard to reserve of clothing to be obtained :- (a) From British sources (b) N.Z. sources. Saw A.D.O.S. W.D.F. again, - called at 2 Cav and had lunch with 6 Fd. Coy at Alexandria. Back to Maadi via the Delta road.
	17		
	18		Advised Lt. Kelsey A.S.O.M.E. who is our representative in the desert of the distribution of W.E. being issued in bulk to the D.A.D.O.S. Unfortunately most of it is still N.A. Drew a number of A.T. Rifles in bulk and sent them off to the desert by truck. Saw A.D.O.S. B.T.E. re requirements of winter clothing - nothing required except gloves woollen.
	19		Had 23 Lewis guns wired up ready for despatch back to N.Z. when shipping space is available. Saw O.S.3. re possibility of getting Vickers guns for the Light Tanks of 2 Cav. None available. Advised O.S.2. of the surplus battle dress etc. we now had owing to summer clothing being worn right through the winter. 	25		Expedited issue of tools to 6 Fd. Coy. Saw A.D.O.S. re training equipment to be made available
	26		for 3 Contingent. Arranged for M.T. to be drawn as soon as units arrive. Only a very modified scale of M.T. available.
	27		Directed disposal of stores. Lt. Harper and W.O.1. Reid went to Suez to supervise unloading of Ordnance stores.
	28		A frantic day endeavouring to collect all the items that had been missed in the bustle of drawing all the equipment at such short notice.
	29		Arranged to draw 6,000 waterbottles at once as none had been brought from N.Z. First three troop trains arrived. Arranged for armourers of 26 Bn to begin zeroing of rifles on 2nd. Oct.

			1. LABOUR. Obtained permission to employ 8 Hops as labourers for an indefinite period as there was a tremendous amount of work involved in clearing up C.E. left in unit lines when they left for the desert.
			2. DEPOT IMPROVEMENTS. (a) Wire Fence. This was erected right round the Ordnance area to prevent unauthorized persons from having access to the very large stocks of C.E. now held as a result of returns from Units and salvage from their lines. (b) ELECTRIC LIGHT. The electric light was installed in the office building. (c) STORES. A commencement was made with the construction of two Ordnance stores - one for clothing and one for C.E.
			3. DRAWING OF C.E. FOR THIRD CONTINGENT. This was most unsatisfactory with the result that large discrepancies were raised by units - in some cases most unjustifiably as events proved. Reason for unsatisfactory method of drawing equipment :- (1) Great shortage of staff hence issue orders not forwarded to Ordnance as early as they should have been. (2) Constant juggling of situation and grouping of certain units meant delay in preparation of I/O's. (3) No firm figures for strength of Units arriving could be obtained until very shortly before they did arrive. (4) Unexpected early arrival of convoy - about a week before expected. (5) No parent units to take over stores, check them and sign for them. (6) After stores actually arrived they could not be adequately safeguarded. (7) Ineptitude of majority of Q.M.'s of new units and consequent discrepancies claimed but often proved to be incorrect. (8) Great haste in which stores had to be drawn and the inexperienced people who handled them.
			4. STAFF. (Cont over) A lot of sickness during the month - see below; but I desire to place on record the very loyal and unsparring efforts of those who were "on deck" at Maadi. They have all
